SINGLES CHAMPIONSHIP FACTS

- The eighth meeting between **Justine Henin**, the current world No.1 and defending champion, and **Maria**Sharapova, the former world No.1 and former champion; they are also the two most recent US Open champions (Sharapova 2006; Henin 2007)
- It is one year to the day since their **last meeting** (November 11, 2006) in the 2006 Sony Ericsson Championships semifinals, their only prior indoor meeting (won by Henin 62 76(5))
- Should Henin beat Sharapova she will be become the sixth woman to successfully defend the Sony Ericsson Championships title (after Evert, Navratilova, Seles, Graf, Clijsters)
- Should Henin win the title and the \$1-million first prize she will become the first woman in professional tennis history to earn more than **\$5 million** in a single season (currently on \$4,367,086)
- Henin is aiming to become the first woman in 10 years to win 10 singles titles in a season; in 1997 Hingis won 12
- Should Sharapova win she will match her 2004 effort of taking the title as the world No.6 and No.6 seed
- Henin is trying to become the first No.1 seed to win the title here since compatriot Kim Clijsters won in 2003
- A victory by Henin will set a new personal best **25 consecutive match wins** and the best unbeaten run since Venus Williams recorded 35 straight victories in 2000; she would also become the first player since Steffi Graf in 1989 to go undefeated in the second half of a season (post-Wimbledon)
- If Henin defends her title she will become the first woman since Graf in 1996 to win Roland Garros, the US Open and the Season-Ending Championships in the same year

DOUBLES CHAMPIONSHIP FACTS

- Cara Black and Liezel Huber are aiming to win their ninth title of 2007 (Raymond/Stosur won 10 in 2006); they're
 contesting their 12 final of the season, having reached the semifinals or better at 22 out of 23 events contested
- Black has been **runner-up** in this event **five times** in the past six years 2001, 2002 (both w/Likhovtseva), 2004, 2005, 2006 (w/Stubbs)
- None of the four finalists has previously won the Sony Ericsson Championships title, although Black and Sugiyama are both former runner-ups
- Black and Huber will finish 2007 co-ranked No.1, only the second team since the inception of computer doubles rankings in 1984 to end a season in that joint position (also Lisa Raymond and Samantha Stosur in 2006)
- Katarina Srebotnik and Ai Sugiyama are aiming to win the title in their first season as a team; they own one title as a team thus far Toronto, where they beat Black/Huber in the final

HENIN FACTS

CHAMPIONSHIPS HISTORY: Fifth appearance in this event for the defending champion (seventh time to qualify); after QF finishes in 2001 (I. to S.Williams) and 2002 (I. to Clijsters), reached SF in 2003, falling to eventual runner-up Mauresmo in 3s; in 2006, collected first Season-Ending Championships title, going 2-1 in RR (d. Petrova, Hingis; I. to Mauresmo) then defeating world No.2 Sharapova in SF and No.1 Mauresmo in final, becoming second Belgian to win the title (Clijsters in 2002-03); despite qualifying, did not compete in 2004 (cytomegalovirus) and 2005 (right hamstring strain)

- Grand Slam play: After missing Australian Open due to personal reasons, went 19-1 in the remaining three majors; won fourth Roland Garros (d. Ivanovic in final to become only fifth woman since 1925 to win four titles in

Paris) and third consecutively (only other woman to achieve the feat in the Open Era was Seles in 1990-92); also became first woman to win three consecutive titles at the same major since Martina Hingis (Australian Open 1997-99); her 2006 and 2007 titles at Roland Garros were won without the loss of a set, an all-time record; seeded No.1 at Wimbledon, shocked in SF by No.18 seed Bartoli 16 75 61 after leading 61 53; at US Open, regained title without the loss of a set (d. Kuznetsova in final), her seventh major (second most among active players behind S.Williams's eight) in her 11th Grand Slam final; she became the first woman to win a Grand Slam singles title having beaten both Williams sisters en route (d. S.Williams in QF, V.Williams in SF)

- Regular Tour season: In addition to her two majors, collected another seven titles in the regular Tour season (from 10 events), two Tier Is (Toronto, Zürich) and five Tier IIs (Dubai, Doha, Warsaw, Eastbourne, Stuttgart), losing only four matches in 62 matches heading into Madrid; after returning to Tour at Paris [Indoors] in February (I. in SF to Safarova), went undefeated in the Middle East, winning first title in Doha and fourth in Dubai (a perfect 16-0 in the latter event); runner-up in Miami (I. to S.Williams 06 75 63 after holding 1 mp at 5-4 second set) before winning second Warsaw title (d. A.Bondarenko in final, improving to 9-0 lifetime in that event); after SF finish in Berlin (I. to Kuznetsova in 3s) and title run at Roland Garros, successfully defended Eastbourne crown (d. Mauresmo in final 76 third set; also needed final-set tie-break to d. Myskina in 2006 final); after SF loss at Wimbledon has gone undefeated, winning Toronto (d. Jankovic in final), US Open, Stuttgart (d. Golovin in final for first title there after runner-up finishes in 2001, 2003) and Zürich (d. Golovin again in final); in Madrid is aiming to become first woman since Graf in 1989 to go undefeated in the second-half of a season (post-Wimbledon); heading into Madrid final has won 24 straight matches, the best on Tour since Henin's 24-match streak in 2005
- Ranking: Has reigned as world No.1 for all but seven weeks in 2007; having started 2007 in the top spot, fell to No.2 (behind Sharapova) after Australian Open (runner-up there in 2006) but regained No.1 on March 19 and has remained there ever since; currently in her 90th week at No.1 in her fourth career stint; will finish No.1 for third time in her career, regardless of her results in Madrid (only seventh woman to do so three or more times)
- Highest 2007 Sony Ericsson Race position: 1st (July present)

CAREER SUMMARY

- Winner of 38 Sony Ericsson WTA Tour singles titles, incl. seven majors (Roland Garros four times in 2003, 2005, 2006 and 2007; one Australian Open in 2004; two US Opens in 2003 and 2007); one Olympic gold medal (2004) and a Tour Championships (2006); four-time Grand Slam runner-up, at 2001 Wimbledon (I. to V.Williams), 2006 Australian Open/Wimbledon (I. to Mauresmo at both) and 2006 US Open (I. to Sharapova); is 38-16 lifetime in Tour singles finals (9-1 in 2007)
- Thirteenth player to hold No.1 Tour Singles Ranking, reaching No.1 on October 20, 2003, after winning Zürich; surrendered it a week later to compatriot Clijsters (first time a new No.1 spent one week on top before losing it) but returned two weeks later, where she stayed 44 straight weeks; regained it after winning Tour Championships last November and held it for 11 weeks before losing it again; began fourth (current) stint at the top during this year's Miami fortnight and is spending her 34th consecutive week (90th overall) on top during Madrid
- Won 1999 Antwerp in Tour main draw debut, becoming the fifth player at that stage to achieve the feat
- Two-time Tour doubles titlist, both in 2002, at Gold Coast (w/Shaughnessy) and Zürich (w/Bovina)
- On ITF Women's Circuit, winner of seven singles titles (most recently in hometown of Liège in 2000) and two doubles titles
- Member of Belgian Fed Cup Team 2000-03, 2006 and Belgian Olympic Team in 2004

• Regardless of her results in Madrid, Justine Henin will record the biggest-ever single-season earnings for a professional female tennis player in 2007; currently with \$4,367,086, Henin has bettered her personal best of \$4,204,810 from 2006 and trails the all-time record of \$4,466,345 – held by her compatriot Kim Clijsters from 2003 – by \$99,259; by reaching the final (minimum \$500,000), the world No.1 will well and truly pass that total; if she wins the title she will become the first woman in professional tennis history to earn more than \$5 million in a single season; below is a look at the Top 5 all-time single-season earnings (official tournament prize money only):

CHAMPIONSHIPS HISTORY: Fourth consecutive appearance in this event, the only player to have competed in every Season-Ending Championships since 2004; won title on debut three years ago as 17-year-old reigning Wimbledon champion, going 2-1 in round robin (d. While the competition in doubles has been fiercer than ever this year one team has outshone the others. The reunited duo of Cara Black and Liezel Huber has enjoyed a dream season, lifting eight titles – including the Australian Open and Wimbledon crowns – in what has been a fairytale return after a year-and-a-half apart.

The Zimbabwean-American pair played their first tournament together nearly 10 years ago, but their first proper spell as a duo only began in earnest at the start of the 2005 season. As a team, success came almost immediately as they emerged victorious at the Tier I event in Rome, before a runner-up finish at Roland Garros and a near flawless title run on the hallowed lawns of the All-England Club. However, disaster struck just five days after their Wimbledon triumph, when Huber suffered a shock left knee injury which would put the American, and the team, out of action for the rest of the year.

Black joined forces with Australian Rennae Stubbs while Huber recuperated and the pair forged a successful partnership. Consequently, the reformation of the Black/Huber alliance was postponed until the start of this year. Although, judging by results so far, they are attempting to make up for lost time. Through their first 22 events of the season, they failed to reach the semifinals only once, reaching 11 finals (winning eight) and another 10 semis.

As a sign of their domination over the field this year, they earned twice as many points in the Race to the Sony Ericsson Championships as their nearest rivals. With the reigning doubles titleholders of the Sony Ericsson Championships (Lisa Raymond and Samantha Stosur) having to miss this year's event (due to Stosur suffering from a viral illness) Black and Huber are the overwhelming favorites to take home the title. A victory would be especially sweet for Black, who has been a finalist in this event in five of the past six years but has never won the big prize.

After a shaky start to life together, the newly-formed team of Katarina Srebotnik and Ai Sugiyama has been improving in leaps and bounds over the past few months and they have now established themselves as one of the most feared partnerships on the Sony Ericsson WTA Tour. They entered this year's Roland Garros with just two wins to their name, but they proceeded to shock several of the game's more recognized teams with a sensational run, eventually losing to fellow rookie pair Alicia Molik and Mara Santangelo in the final.

The Slovene-Japanese duo promptly followed this up with another impressive runner-up finish, this time at Wimbledon, losing to the world's top team, Cara Black and Liezel Huber, in a thrilling three-set final. Their rise up the Sony Ericsson Race standings continued through the summer months, with semifinal showings on the hardcourts of Stanford and San Diego before a magnificent title run at the prestigious Tier I event in Toronto.

Srebotnik and Sugiyama's triumph in Canada saw them not only overcome their conquerors at Stade Roland Garros, but also gain sweet revenge on their painful defeat at the All-England Club with victory over Black and Huber in the final. With their first title and victories over several of the principal rivals already under their belt, they are rapidly making a name for themselves.

SEMIFINALISTS DECIDED

The names of the four women who will contest the 2007 Sony Ericsson Championships singles semifinals are already known, with one day of round robin play remaining. Anna Chakvetadze, Justine Henin, Ana Ivanovic and Maria Sharapova are through to the final four, although who plays who is not yet clear.

While a dominant world No.1 and defending champion, Belgium's Henin, was a clear-cut Yellow Group leader (with Chakvetadze in second place), Friday's clash between Ivanovic and Sharapova will determine who finishes first in the Red Group. The loser of that match will meet Henin in the semifinals, while the winner plays Chakvetadze.

Although the remaining two matches have no impact on the semifinal line-up both of them will determine the third and fourth placements in each Group (and thus ranking point and prize money payments). Jelena Jankovic and Marion Bartoli go head-to-head in the Yellow Group and Svetlana Kuznetsova takes on Daniela Hantuchova in the Red Group.

Serena Williams, who pulled out of the tournament with a left knee injury, will receive 35 ranking points and \$33,333 for playing one of her three scheduled round robin matches. Bartoli, who replaced Williams, will receive 70 or 150 ranking points, and \$66,667 or \$96,667, depending on her placement in the Yellow Group.

UPDATED THROUGH NOVEMBER 8, 2007

SEMIFINALISTS DECIDED

The names of the four women who will contest the 2007 Sony Ericsson Championships singles semifinals are already known, with one day of round robin play remaining. Anna Chakvetadze, Justine Henin, Ana Ivanovic and Maria Sharapova are through to the final four, although who plays who is not yet clear. While a dominant world No.1 and defending champion, Belgium's Henin, was a clear-cut Yellow Group leader (with Chakvetadze in second place), Friday's clash between Ivanovic and Sharapova will determine who finishes first in the Red Group. The loser of that match will meet Henin in the semifinals, while the winner plays Chakvetadze.

Although the remaining two matches have no impact on the semifinal line-up both of them will determine the third and fourth placements in each Group (and thus ranking point and prize money payments). Jelena Jankovic and Marion Bartoli go head-to-head in the Yellow Group and Svetlana Kuznetsova takes on Daniela Hantuchova in the Red Group. Serena Williams, who pulled out of the tournament with a left knee injury, will receive 35 ranking points and \$33,333 for playing one of her three scheduled round robin matches. Bartoli, who replaced Williams, will receive 70 or 150 ranking points, and \$66,667 or \$96,667, depending on her placement in the Yellow Group.

RANKING PROJECTIONS

- Justine Henin will remain at No.1 next week, ensuring her third year-end No.1 and second in succession
- Svetlana Kuznetsova will remain at No.2 unless Ana Ivanovic wins the title; Ivanovic will overtake current No.3 Jelena Jankovic if she reaches the final but remain at No.4 if she loses in Saturday's semifinals
- Current No.7 Anna Chakvetadze will return to the Top 5 at No.5 (pushing Serena Williams down one spot) unless Maria Sharapova wins the title, in which case the 2004 champion in this event will rise one spot to No.5

BLACK/HUBER NAMED 2007 SONY ERICSSON WTA TOUR TEAM OF THE YEAR

Cara Black from Zimbabwe and recently naturalized American citizen Liezel Huber will conclude the 2007 season as the world No.1 in doubles, both as a team and individually on the rankings. They are only the fourth team to jointly hold the Sony Ericsson WTA Tour Doubles Ranking since its inception in 1984 and only the second team to finish a season in that position.

In 2007, the African-born pair has reached the semifinals or better of 21 of the 22 tournaments they have played entering the Sony Ericsson Championships, winning eight titles, including two Grand Slams. The pair will finish the season as the joint-top ranked players on the Sony Ericsson WTA Tour Doubles Rankings on November 12.

"It's been a fantastic year, not only for us but for our husbands as well, who contribute a great amount to our success," said 28-year-old Black. "We are really excited about finishing the year No.1. I think the highlight for me was winning our second Wimbledon title together. We have a great time on the road, we are great friends and really enjoy each others company and I think that has been a key factor as to why we have done so well."

"It's been an incredible year; we started the year off strong, which really motivated us to do even better," said 31-year-old Huber. "We just kept going and are so happy now with the end result. We've worked hard as a team and have a lot of great memories. Our husbands think they are both comedians, so it makes for fun times on and off the court. My prize money will be going towards building a tennis center, it's a dream come true for me personally. My parents were present when I won my first Grand Slam title and they will be here in Madrid, as we conclude the year at No.1. I couldn't ask for more!"

"Cara and Liezel have had an exemplary season winning eight Sony Ericsson WTA Tour titles, including the Australian Open and Wimbledon, as well as being the top team still in the hunt for the season-ending Sony Ericsson Championships title," said Sony Ericsson WTA Tour Chairman and CEO Larry Scott. "Their passion for the game of doubles, both off and on the court is inspiring to many and their professional approach to the sport is one of the major keys to their success in 2007. I congratulate them on their achievement."

Black and Huber first teamed up on the Sony Ericsson WTA Tour in 2001, winning their very first tournament in Tokyo before playing sporadically until the start of 2005. There they really came into form winning Rome, reaching the final of the Roland Garros and winning Wimbledon (their third tournament victory) before Huber suffered a severe ACL injury which later required surgery bringing their season to a premature end. The two reunited at the start of the 2007 season, winning their fourth tournament together at the Australian Open and haven't looked back since. Black has held the No.1 ranking individually since July 9 following their Wimbledon success and Liezel will join her at No.1 for the first time in her career. She is the 22nd woman since Doubles Rankings began in 1984 to attain that position.

DOUBLES TEAM PROFILES

(1) CARA BLACK (ZIM) / LIEZEL HUBER (USA)

While the competition in doubles has been fiercer than ever this year one team has outshone the others. The reunited duo of Cara Black and Liezel Huber has enjoyed a dream season, lifting eight titles – including the Australian Open and Wimbledon crowns – in what has been a fairytale return after a year-and-a-half apart.

The Zimbabwean-American pair played their first tournament together nearly 10 years ago, but their first proper spell as a duo only began in earnest at the start of the 2005 season. As a team, success came almost immediately as they emerged victorious at the Tier I event in Rome, before a runner-up finish at Roland Garros and a near flawless title run on the hallowed lawns of the All-England Club. However, disaster struck just five days after their Wimbledon triumph, when Huber suffered a shock left knee injury which would put the American, and the team, out of action for the rest of the year.

Black joined forces with Australian Rennae Stubbs while Huber recuperated and the pair forged a successful partnership. Consequently, the reformation of the Black/Huber alliance was postponed until the start of this year. Although, judging by results so far, they are attempting to make up for lost time. Through their first 22 events of the season, they failed to reach the semifinals only once, reaching 11 finals (winning eight) and another 10 semis.

As a sign of their domination over the field this year, they earned twice as many points in the Race to the Sony Ericsson Championships as their nearest rivals. With the reigning doubles titleholders of the Sony Ericsson Championships (Lisa Raymond and Samantha Stosur) having to miss this year's event (due to Stosur suffering from a viral illness) Black and Huber are the overwhelming favorites to take home the title. A victory would be especially sweet for Black, who has been a finalist in this event in five of the past six years but has never won the big prize.

(2) CHAN YUNG-JAN (TPE) / CHUANG CHIA-JUNG (TPE)

Chinese Taipei is not a traditional tennis heavyweight, but in Chan Yung-Jan and Chuang Chia-Jung they have one of the finest young doubles partnerships on the Sony Ericsson WTA Tour. The pair first came to prominence at the start of the year when they shocked the doubles draw with a sensational run to the final of the Australian Open, eventually losing to No.3 seeds Cara Black and Liezel Huber. Their heroics in Australia were a mere taster of what they had in store for the tennis world in 2007 and the proceeding nine months has seen them make a meteoric rise up the rankings and capture three titles along the way.

Going into Melbourne with a lowly combined ranking of No.182 they defeated among others Yan Zi and Zheng Jie (the defending champions) en route to the final in what was just their third Tour event in tandem and their first major. This achievement also gained them a place in the history books – becoming the first players from their homeland to make it through to the final of a Grand Slam.

The rest of the year has proved the duo to be anything but one-hit wonders, winning titles in Bangalore, Birmingham and 's-Hertogenbosch as well as runner-up finishes in Pattaya City, Indian Wells and most recently the US Open. They have become the first women from their country to qualify for the Sony Ericsson Championships.

Despite the shockwaves they have caused this year their first title on Tour came way back in 2005 when they defeated all comers in Seoul and with their near unrivaled consistency – they have lost a mere 17 matches since joining forces more than two years ago – and regular successes they could be one partnership residing at the top of the sport for many years to come.

(3) KATARINA SREBOTNIK (SLO) / AI SUGIYAMA (JPN)

After a shaky start to life together, the newly-formed team of Katarina Srebotnik and Ai Sugiyama has been improving in leaps and bounds over the past few months and they have now established themselves as one of the most feared partnerships on the Sony Ericsson WTA Tour. They entered this year's Roland Garros with just two wins to their name, but they proceeded to shock several of the game's more recognized teams with a sensational run, eventually losing to fellow rookie pair Alicia Molik and Mara Santangelo in the final.

The Slovene-Japanese duo promptly followed this up with another impressive runner-up finish, this time at Wimbledon, losing to the world's top team, Cara Black and Liezel Huber, in a thrilling three-set final. Their rise up the Sony Ericsson Race standings continued through the summer months, with semifinal showings on the hardcourts of Stanford and San Diego before a magnificent title run at the prestigious Tier I event in Toronto.

Srebotnik and Sugiyama's triumph in Canada saw them not only overcome their conquerors at Stade Roland Garros, but also gain sweet revenge on their painful defeat at the All-England Club with victory over Black and Huber in the final. With their first title and victories over several of the principal rivals already under their belt, they are rapidly making a name for themselves.

Kveta Peschke and Rennae Stubbs have been a partnership for little more than six months, but their immediate success has seen the duo establish themselves as one of the teams to beat. After a solid start to life as a team during the European clay court swing, the Czech-Australian partnership really came into its own when the Tour hit the grass courts of Great Britain. They reached their first final in unison at Eastbourne, before going all the way to the quarterfinals on the hallowed lawns of the All-England Club, falling victim to Lisa Raymond and Samantha Stosur on both occasions.

The summer of 2007 also brought Peschke and Stubbs their first silverware in tandem when they stormed through the draw in Los Angeles, capturing the hardcourt title with a sensational 61 60 destruction of top seeds Alicia Molik and Mara Santangelo in the final. This triumph was swiftly followed by back-to-back semifinal appearances, most notably at the US Open, where they narrowly lost to eventual champions Nathalie Dechy and Dinara Safina.

Prior to joining forces Peschke and Stubbs had enjoyed considerable success on the doubles court with over 60 titles between them and after hitting it off almost instantaneously, more success looks set to follow. They have already notched up victories over several of their main rivals - including the Tour's top team of Cara Black and Liezel Huber - and their recent indoor title runs in Stuttgart and Zürich indicate the partnership is going from strength to strength and is a real title threat in Madrid.
